


<b>Title:</b>	<b>Targets for women award holders and positive action<sup>1)</sup></b>
<b>Implementation</b>	
<b>Field(s) of Action:</b>	* Presence and Visibility
<b>Objectives:</b>	* To increase the number of female applicants * One of the objectives of the Science Foundation Ireland Gender Strategy 2016-2020 <sup>2)</sup> is to achieve a target of 30% women award holders by 2020, against a benchmark of 21% in 2015. Several measures are envisaged in the strategy; however, in 2015 the Starting Investigator Research Grant (SIR G) Award Programme incorporated a gender initiative, ensuring that half of eligible applicants are women.
<b>Target Group(s):</b>	Female candidates
<b>Description:</b>	This gender initiative led to an increase in the number of women applicants from 27% in 2013 to 47% in 2015. As a result of the usual peer-review process, of the 20 proposals awarded in 2015, 55% of awardees were women, compared to only 27% in 2013. Additionally, SFI continues to allow extended eligibility timeframes for applicants who undertook career breaks, and also annually publishes gender-disaggregated data on funded award holders and research team members which inform redressing actions.
